Yakovliev awarded SPIE Travel Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA – 9 July 2015 – Artem Yakovliev has been awarded a 2015 Travel Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics for his potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics or related field.



Yakovliev is a graduate student pursuing a Master's degree at Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv (Ukraine). His research, supervised by Professor Serhiy Kondratenko, is focused on the investigating of photoelectric and transient properties of p-i-n solar cells with quantum objects in the intrinsic region. Another direction of his work is creating software using LabVIEW environment.

In 2015 SPIE awarded \$353,000 in education and travel scholarships to 126 outstanding individuals, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Award-winning applicants were evaluated, selected and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, Chaired by SPIE volunteer Cristina Solano.

Through 2014, SPIE has distributed over \$4.5 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
