## Tomaszewska awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA – 19 May 2015 – Monika Tomaszewska has been awarded a 2015 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics for her potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics or related field.

Tomaszewska is a PhD student studying remote sensing system for monitoring grassland conditions at the University of Warsaw (Poland). In addition she conducts research in the Remote Sensing Center and is focused on the applicability of GIS and Remote Sensing techniques in the Environmental Studies. In 2013, she spent 6 months in Geospatial Sciences Center of Excellence (GSCE), South Dakota State University (USA) working on a NASA funded project, “Storms, Forms, and Complexity of the Urban Canopy: How Land Use, Settlement Patterns, and the Shapes of Cities Influence Severe Weather.”



In 2015 SPIE awarded \$353,000 in education and travel scholarships to 126 outstanding individuals, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Award-winning applicants were evaluated, selected and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, Chaired by SPIE volunteer Cristina Solano.

Through 2014, SPIE has distributed over \$4.5 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
