Huang awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA – 20 May 2015 – Ziyin Huang has been awarded a 2015 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics for his potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics or related field.



Huang is a student in the BS/MS accelerated degree program in materials science and engineering with a concentration in electronic and photonic materials with minors in chemistry, electrical engineering and mathematics at Drexel University (USA). His research projects include polymer crystallization at liquid-liquid interface, inorganic nanoparticles assembly, and polymer electrolyte membrane. He is the president of the Drexel Material Advantage Chapter, vice president of Tau Beta Pi Pennsylvania Zeta Chapter, and a member of SPIE, IEEE, ACS, MRS and Sigma Xi. He is interested in STEM outreach and EPICS projects, and is a singer and a percussionist in his spare time.

In 2015 SPIE awarded \$353,000 in education and travel scholarships to 126 outstanding individuals, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Award-winning applicants were evaluated, selected and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, Chaired by SPIE volunteer Cristina Solano.

Through 2014, SPIE has distributed over \$4.5 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
