First things first, follow SPIE on social media

Always tag SPIE in your social media posts.











Components of a perfect post

The following elements make a great post. Be sure to include them whenever you promote your call for papers on social media.

- Include an image or video, either one that SPIE provides or a screenshot from the conference page. Bonus: if you are posting to LinkedIn, you can upload your call for papers flyer.
- Tag others involved in the event co-chairs, program committee members, confirmed speakers, sponsors, etc.
- Don't forget to include the URL to the submission page



Components of a promotional email signature

Promote the meeting and call for papers by adding a temporary line in your email signature. Hyperlink the sentence to direct people to the submission page for the conference.
