## Yang awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA – June 7, 2019 – **Lin Yang** has been awarded a 2019 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for his potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics or related field.



Yang is a PhD Candidate at Technical University Berlin (Germany) majoring in experimental physics. He is studying in Biomedical Optics in the National Metrology Institute of Germany (Physikalisch-Technische Bundesanstalt) with Prof. Rainer Macdonald and Dr. Heidrun Wabnitz. His current research orientation is on monitoring human brain by near infrared spectroscopy. Yang has authored/co-authored eight journal articles and conference proceedings, and given several presentations at SPIE conferences. As a rising junior, Yang is also a recipient of Marie Skłodowska-Curie Early-stage researcher scholarship of the European Commission.

The Society awarded \$298,000 in education scholarships to 84 outstanding SPIE student members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Award-winning applicants were evaluated, selected and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, Chaired by SPIE volunteer Jeremy Bos.

Through 2018, SPIE has distributed \$6 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
