Lin awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA – May 31, 2019 – **Yen-Ju Lin** has been awarded a 2019 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for her potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics or related field.



Lin is a PhD student in the Terahertz Electronics Laboratory led by Prof. Mona Jarrahi at the University of California, Los Angeles (United States). Her research focuses on developing a novel terahertz nanoscopy system for label-free biological studies. She is also collaborating with the Molecular Foundry in the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory (LBNL), working on the advanced nanofabrication to improve the performance of this nanoscopy system. Lin is the vice president of the OSA/SPIE student chapter at UCLA. She is very passionate about promoting and sharing knowledge of optics and photonics and has organized and participated in several outreach activities.

The Society awarded \$298,000 in education scholarships to 84 outstanding SPIE student members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Award-winning applicants were evaluated, selected and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, Chaired by SPIE volunteer Jeremy Bos.

Through 2018, SPIE has distributed \$6 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
