

## Qian awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA — **Jiaming Qian** has been awarded a 2023 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics, or related field.



Qian is a PhD candidate supervised by Professor Chao Zuo at Nanjing University of Science and Technology (China). He is committed to the development of novel computational imaging and sensing technologies in the fields of life sciences and intelligent manufacturing, with a special focus on Fringe Projection Profilometry (FPP) and Structured Illumination Microscopy (SIM). He has authored 16 peer-reviewed journal publications with over 800 citations. His research has been featured on journal covers four times and highlighted by multiple publications and platforms including *Nature*, *Light: Science & Applications*, AIP *Scilight*, and Wiley Industry News. "Beyond

research, I am passionate about sharing my research with the public," said Qian. "I believe that optics will make the world better, both present and future."

In 2023, the Society is awarding \$293,000 in education scholarships to 72 outstanding SPIE Student Members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Awardwinning applicants were evaluated, selected, and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, chaired by SPIE Senior Member Brian Primeau.

Since the program began, SPIE has distributed more than \$7 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
