Soskind awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA — **Michael Soskind** has been awarded a 2023 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics, or related field.



Soskind is a PhD candidate in Electrical and Computer Engineering at Princeton University (USA), working under the guidance of Professor Gerard Wysocki. Soskind's research interests focus on developing novel spectroscopic instrumentation, with an emphasis on advancing laser-based sensing technologies, beam pointing and tracking techniques, and laser power-scaling methods. "My work has been applied to fugitive methane detection for environmental monitoring, higher power spectroscopic source

development using nonlinear techniques and active control, and novel detection architectures," said Soskind. His research efforts have resulted in 34 co-authored journal and conference publications.

In 2023, the Society is awarding \$293,000 in education scholarships to 72 outstanding SPIE Student Members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Awardwinning applicants were evaluated, selected, and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, chaired by SPIE Senior Member Brian Primeau.

Since the program began, SPIE has distributed more than \$7 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
