Jin awarded SPIE Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA — **Na (Norah) Jin** has been awarded a 2023 Optics and Photonics Education Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for potential contributions to the field of optics, photonics, or related field.



Jin is a fourth-year PhD candidate affiliated with the Department of Chemistry at Brown University (USA), under the guidance of Professor Ou Chen. Jin's primary research revolves around the design of fluorescent quantum dot-metal heterostructures and their applications in photocatalysis. Additionally, she is deeply interested in exploring highpressure processing techniques for semiconductor nanocrystals and the

creation of high-quality fluorescent quantum dots for the purpose of developing advanced light-emitting diodes. "As a scientist, I am driven by a mission to leverage the power of light in order to address pressing environmental challenges through photocatalytic fuel production," said Jin.

In 2023, the Society is awarding \$293,000 in education scholarships to 72 outstanding SPIE Student Members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Award-winning applicants were evaluated, selected, and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, chaired by SPIE Senior Member Brian Primeau.

Since the program began, SPIE has distributed more than \$7 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education and to the next generation of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
