## Caitlin Smith awarded an SPIE Optics and Photonics Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA — **Caitlin Smith** has been awarded a 2024 Optics and Photonics Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for potential contributions to optics, photonics, or a related field.



Smith is a PhD student at the University of Auckland in the Department of Physics, under the supervision of **Jami Shepherd**, **Guillaume Renaud** (TU Delft) and **Kasper van Wijk**. Her work in the Physical Acoustics Laboratory focuses on developing photoacoustic and ultrasound techniques to quantify and study hemodynamics in bone. She is also the 2024 President of the university's SPIE student chapter and is actively involved in outreach and student engagement with the Dodd-Walls Centre for Photonics and Quantum Technologies. "My passion for research is motivated by

its potential for real-world applications to improve patient outcomes," said Smith.

This month, the Society is awarding \$303,000 in scholarships to 72 outstanding SPIE Student Members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Successful applicants were evaluated, selected, and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, chaired by **SPIE Senior Member Brian Primeau**.

Since this program began in 1978, SPIE has distributed more than \$7.5 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education as well as to the future generations of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
